- ❖ Junior Varsity Volleyball is 5-1 in league. Their goal this season is to have a winning record.




Girls Soccer has a record of 4-2 in league. There are working on a new formation and working as a team.

We don't have the same schedule everyday we have a schedule for one week and it doesn't change during the year and we don't choose our subjects like you can in America.

Every girls in france, their dream is to be cheerleader and have an American boyfriend, haha, and for boys is to do football American and have an American girlfriend, yeah that's funny. We lost a tough, caring character with a strong dedicated heart. Rob Rumfelt lost his life while serving and protecting his community. Many of us at CLHS -- student and staff -- knew Rumfelt and shared many unforgettable

memories with him and learned valuable lessons from his as well.

The CLHS football team is dedicating their season to Coach Rumfelt. On September 8th of 2017 the CLHS Varsity football team had their first home league game against Fort Bragg. The Cardinals pulled through in overtime taking the WIN. They finished strong as Rumfelt would have expected them too.

After the game football players, students, law enforcement, and many other volunteers helped set up chairs for Rumflet's memorial the next morning, August 8th 2017.

To honor Rob Rumfelt Carina Martinez-Lopez, a Senior at CLHS will be putting on an obstacle course mud run in the Spring - April 21st, of 2018. The "Rummy Skull Crusher." All her proceeds will go toward a glass memorial panel that will be put up on the football field to honor and remember Coach Rumfelt. The glass panel will include quotes by Rumfelt as well as memories and lessons shared with this hero.






